

He has supported and encouraged the Den Leaders to continue meeting virtually, has organized unit meetings and officiated at Committee meetings.


He is a regular attendee at Roundtable and supports Council and District events. He was POC for rechartering and rechartered a majority of youth, on time.


Troop 349B
