



- Klondike Derby can be dependent on weather.


#### What Changes does your unit want in GM Program?

- A unit has an obligation to support as much as possible District events. The Troop I work with prioritizes attending District Camporees and where possible other District events.
- We recruit and train the scouts and adult leaders to attend District events.

## Support Your Unit Needs from District?

#### Cubs

- Better direct line of communication
- Program support

- We are good
- Easier process for merit badge counselor approval/retention. Current process is onerous and dissuades participation.
- Information and training opportunities.
- Help with BSA system issues/rechartering, training questions, MB counselor applications/questions. Events that are harder to do at the unit level (like Merit Badge day, Flags In) and need critical mass to run.
- None over what is done now. (5)
- There is a lot of frustration managing up, weeks without return e-mails or calls, lack of clarity on process and contacts and employee turnover. Single point of contact for each troop and professional follow-up would solve most of the issues.

## Support Your Unit Needs from District (Cont.)?

- Efficient, non-repetitive communications would be helpful. Constant, multiple repetitive communications dilutes attention to the communications just stop looking at them.
- A few well planned and executed district events each year.



## What Changes Would you Make to Roundtable?

#### Cubs

• No Feedback

- I'm not sure how it can be more useful besides maybe hearing from different Troops and Packs about their struggles and success stories that happened from the last roundtable. I have been going to the Roundtable for several years and unfortunately I know little about what other troops are going through and I feel a like everyone is working in their own little silo. I was once in a Pack in Hawaii and every week we would get together to fellowship and several parents were assigned to bring lunch for the entire pack, I feel the activity of breaking bread together brought the Pack closer. I feel food brings people together and helps build better relationships. Maybe we can ask the RoundTable attendees if they would be interested in doing monthly potlucks. I envision breaking up the attendees and assigning each group to a particular month to be responsible to bring a home cooked meal or snack to share (No store bought packaged meals). I'm sorry but cheese and coldcuts don't really do much for me like someone actually putting effort into cooking a small meal or snack. Ask Mark Serfas about his home made lasagna
- More detail in minutes would be helpful..
- If you could organize the Cub Scout related materials in one part and the ScoutsBSA materials in another part and put the announcements in the middle that would be helpful. The ScoutsBSA information usually is of limited interest to the Cub Scout people.
- Our CO only provides meeting space on Thursday nights. Scoutmaster listens into Roundtable stream while physically attending troop's meeting.

# What Changes Would You Make to Roundtable (cont.)?

- Content at roundtable is very helpful. Cub scout topics are less relevant to troops and vice versa (not sure how you can really change that, though). If meetings could be kept to an hour, that would be ideal (although has no bearing on usefulness to the unit). Please keep zoom option as sometimes it is not feasible to attend in person. Minutes are detailed and provide lists of dates (this is a good thing) but attending is better, even if virtual.
- More sharing of ideas for activities.
- Split into two meetings on the same night. Earlier for Cub Scouts and later for Scouts BSA. Do not present material that we already have in writing, just summarize. Keep meetings to one hour each with 30 minutes afterwards for leaders to stay and ask questions.

- It would be nice if it were an hour long as in the past.
- I think the District does a pretty good job of supporting my unit.




## Scouting for Food

- Stay tuned for more "Pi Day" activities as we get closer to the big day!






### 2022 George Mason Pinewood Derby



- Be sure the counselor uses his/her legal name no nicknames.
- Merit Badge Counselors, or the unit Dean/Leader, also need to scan and send Margee the Merit Badge Counselor Information Form listing the badges the counselor is applying to teach and providing a justification of his/her qualifications.
