District Award of Merit

The District Award of Merit is presented by the District to Scouters who have rendered service of an outstanding nature to youth, both in the community and in Scouting. This is the highest award a District can bestow on a Scouter.



District Award of Merit – Andrew Zaso

Since 2019, Andy has been a member of the District Committee, coordinating multiple successful Camporees that provided opportunities for District youth to compete in Scout skills, shooting sports, pioneering, cooking and many other fun activities. An active member of his community, Andy also is active in the Knights of Columbus and has served the Order as a Grand Knight.

District Award of Merit – Steen Simonsen






Coz Adams


Brian Heath
