

Chair's Chat

As I write this note I am realizing that this may be my last Chairs' Chat and the last GM Newsletter of 2023. It is time to review and see what we have accomplished and look forward to where we can go in the coming years. So where are we?

For the last 2 months I have been visiting with many of our Packs as they conducted their new member Join Scouting events. It was great to see the enthusiasm and commitment of the leaders and the happy, eager faces of the potential new Scouts. What is the result? As of Oct. 25th, our Cub membership is 914 the same as at the end of October 2023. Our Scouts BSA membership is down 50 from last year, mostly due to aging out. Our total membership of 1689 is just 133 short of our goal for 3% growth in 2023. In



addition, we have a new Pack and a new girl troop under development and 2 new Crews formed this year. This is great. It shows that we have an eager Scouting audience and leaders who want to deliver the promise of Scouting.

What remains to be done with membership? We need to make sure all those who visited our Packs get follow up if they have not yet joined. We need to attract and register more girls in both Cub Scouts and Scouts BSA. We need to continue to recruit in our minority communities and we need to make sure no one is denied the opportunity to join Scouts for financial reasons.

Even though we are facing some financial headwinds, we have succeeded in reaching our Friends of Scouting fundraising goal and did it early. Popcorn sales are ongoing. Popcorn sales helps our units fund their program for the year. It can also help Scouts pay their own way and cover unit dues, registration and summer camp.

Our program has been going great this year. We had a terrific District Pinewood Derby in March, a great Spring Camporee and our Fall Camporee just set new attendance highs with 2/3 of our Troops attending. In May we had a fine turnout for our Flags In event and hope to have a great attendance for the Veteran's Day Flags In. Many Scouts have been taking advantage of the Life to Eagle Seminars.

What lies ahead for program? This year the emphasis has been on getting all leaders trained for their position. That effort continues as we seek to get all Den leaders trained. Trained leaders are more confident and effective in their job and deliver a better program to their Scouts.

Our District Annual Meeting is coming up on November 29th. If you are a Charter Organization Representative or a District Committee Member, I hope you will join us. We will be presenting a full District status report and electing our District Committee to serve us for 2023.

Cub Pack Updates from National

Coming soon: Cub Scout packs can camp up to two consecutive nights

Effective Sept. 1, 2023, Cub Scout packs who are conducting their own overnight camping activities may now camp up to two consecutive nights.

This is a change from the earlier policy on pack unit-coordinated camping, which was previously limited to single overnight experiences.

The updated policy also applies to Webelos and Arrow of Light dens, who can now conduct campouts for up to two consecutive nights.

Unit Key-3 Training

Adult Leaders with direct contact with the Scotus (i.e. Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, etc.) are highly encouraged to become fully "trained". To be "Trained" requires mostly on-line training which is available at your convenience. There is one in=person course that is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters – Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS). Requirements are discussed below.

To be fully Trained for <u>Committee Chairman</u>, <u>Chartering Organization Representative</u>, and <u>New Member Coordinator</u> requires current Youth Protection Training (YPT) and completion of specific online courses found at My.Scouting.org. (YPT expires after 2 years. The other on-line training for these jobs does not expire.)

To be fully Trained for **Cubmaster**:

- Requires current Youth Protection Training (YPT).
- Completion of Cubmaster specific training course available on-line at My.Scouting.org. (This course is also available in-person at various places and on various dates around the Council.) This course does not expire.
- Completion of the Hazardous Weather Course. This course is only available on-line at My.Scouting.org. It expires after 2 years.

To be fully Trained for **Scoutmaster**:

- Requires current Youth Protection Training (YPT).
- Completion of Scoutmaster specific training course available on-line at My.Scouting.org. (This course is also available in-person at various places and on various dates around the Council.) This course does not expire.
- Completion of the Hazardous Weather Course. This course is only available on-line at My.Scouting.org. It expires after 2 years.
- Completion of Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS). This course is an in-person class only. It requires an overnight camping experience. It is available at various places and on dates around the Council. It May be available at some summer camps. It does not expire.

- 2. Registration will open in December 2023 on the Corsizio BSA George Mason District Events website.
- We will need the Unit Merit Badge Day Coordinator names and contact details by November 30th to John Drisco at gmasonmeritbadgeday@gmail.com
- Encourage Scouts to get their merit badge books by December 31. Read the requirements and start tackling "pre-work" by early January 2024.
- 5. Note: The "pre-work" is not the same as a "prerequisite." The "pre-work" consists of tasks/activities that the Scout is advised to do in advance of the Merit Badge Day. A Scout can still participate in the Merit Badge Day class if he hasn't completed the pre-work but failure to complete the pre-work may mean the Scout leaves the Merit Badge Day with a partial badge. A prerequisite is something that must be done in order to qualify to take the class. The only prerequisite we are aware of for the George Mason Merit Badge Day is that the Scout must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts in a participating unit.



Camp Olmsted - Scouts BSA / Venturing

Camp Olmsted is a center for STEM, hosting the "Tech Center" with programs including robotics, animation, and design. Olmsted also offers wide variety of programs in aquatics, ecology, outdoor skills, shooting sports, and crafts. Units at Olmsted enjoy meals prepared in the Forster Dining Hall and take part in a dynamic "dining hall program." Camp Olmsted offers camping for 400 and is the largest camp at the Goshen Scout Reservation.

Camp Bowman - Scouts BSA / Venturing

Units who attend Camp Bowman will take part in the Patrol Cooking program, creating the opportunity for Scouts to apply their new and developing scout skills. By working together to cook each meal and care for the campsite, Camp Bowman units see growth in scout independence and teamwork. Camp Bowman offers camping for 300, and includes program areas for outdoor skills, shooting sports, aquatics, crafts, and more.





Camp Marriott - Scouts BSA / Venturing

With a focus on vocational and trade skills, Camp Marriott offers a large variety of merit badge programs in areas including aquatics, ecology, outdoor skills, shooting sports, and eagle advancement. With an emphasis on vocational and trade skills, "The Guild" hosts classes in metal working, welding, automotive maintenance. Camp Marriott offers camping for 300 and offers patrol cooking and "heater stack" dining methods. Camp Marriott is also home to GSR's Provisional Camp program.

Camp Ross - Webelos and AOL Scouts

With the goal to give scouts "a great week and an introduction to scouting," Camp Ross serves as week-long introduction into the Scouts BSA program and future scouting experiences. Camp Ross offers camping for 300 and supports programs in nature, outdoor skills, crafts, shooting sports, and aquatics (including a water trampoline!). Units at Camp Ross enjoy meals from the Dining Hall and participate in camp songs and celebrations with the staff.






Lenhok'sin High Adventure - Backpacking and Canoeing Treks

For most positions, the primary focus is delivering program to youth and adult participants, whether in a program area or a wilderness outpost. Other responsibilities include general duties based on the operations of camp.

Room and board are provided. Staff at Snyder return home for their weekly day off while staff at Goshen live on site and go into town.

2023 Journey to Excellence – NEW INFO from BSA

Journey to Excellence is the Boy Scouts of America program to help Packs, Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts to plan, monitor and evaluate their performance and their ability to serve youth. There are specific criteria for the unit to plan and accomplish. These standards are reviewed each year and revised standards are published.

The 2023 Journey to Excellence Standards are now available.

Here are the major changes in the JTE scorecards for 2022.

- 1. The standards are written as activities that the unit will do. This is to emphasize that JTE is primarily a planning tool.
- 2. The Cub Scout scorecard has many changed standards. This is because of changes in the Cub Scout program.
- 3. For standard #10, Gold now includes recruiting a new leader. We have found that the best units continually recruit parents and other adults who have never been involved in Scouting.

There is no requirement, no expectation and, in fact, we might discourage a unit from believing that they should achieve Gold in all JTE criteria. A great unit is balanced in the service that it provides to youth. There is no shame and no problem if a unit achieves Silver or Bronze. That unit is serving youth. We regard the various colors as meaning:

Bronze – Effective Silver – Excellent Gold – Exceptional
