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2024-2025 OFFERINGS BACK COUNTRY OUTDOOR LEADER SKILLS

DON'T BE THIS GUY



GET BCOLS TRAINED

This course was developed by a group of Scouters in 1993; it has been continually updated to meet current techniques and technology. This course is designed to support the older youth programs of the BSA. It is aimed at all adults working with older youth regardless of program (Boy Scouting, Venturing, or Exploring). Cub Scout Leaders or people without camping experience SHOULD NOT training this training. All participants MUST complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills, as well as the position-specific training for their program area prior to attending this course. All participants must be able to meet current physical requirements of the BSA Annual Health & Medical Record.

The target audience is adult leaders planning High Adventure treks at backcountry venues not supported by BSA infrastructure; however, units planning to attend High Adventure bases supported by BSA will find this course useful, because unit shakedowns will, most likely, take place in venues not supported by BSA infrastructure. If you are participating in an NCAC-sponsored High Adventure Trek, you must also take the course offered by the NCAC High Adventure Committee.

Youth participants (16 and up) will be admitted on an individual basis and requires the nomination by the unit leader. Youth must have completed unit leadership training (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops or Crews, etc.) as well as National Youth Leadership Training.

Back Country Outdoor Leader Skills is offered by the Council Training Committee as an optional follow-on to the basic course, Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills. Its goal is to provide adult leaders with an overview of such topics as:

- Stove Maintenance Risk Management Equipment Maintenance Crew Equipment Needs & Selection •
- Personal Equipment Needs & Selection
 Terrain Awareness & Land Navigation
 Menu Planning & Clean-up
 Hygiene & Health
 On the Trail Tips
 Wilderness First Aid Overview

<u>Part 1</u> — Addresses ways to effectively work with older youth and covers the detailed preparation and planning that must be done before you go out, including risk management. Summarizes the personal and crew equipment used for lightweight camping. Plans are also made for the weekend overnight session. (Part 1 is the EXPLAIN & DEMONSTRATE part of EDGE.)

<u>Part 2</u> — Participants will practice core leader skills for the outdoor program — Leave No Trace, navigation (map & compass plus GPS), terrain awareness, expedition menu planning and food preparation, stove and stove maintenance, wilderness first aid issues, expedition health and hygiene, team building. (Part 2 is the GUIDE part of EDGE.)

<u>Part 3</u> — While not required, we strongly suggest participation in the Hikeoree which will allow BCOLS trained leaders to apply the BCOLS training with their youth at a real-world event. (Part 3 is the ENABLE part of EDGE.)

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Aviation Merit Badge Program




Organized by Merit Badge Counselors who are also Docents at the Smithsonian National Air & Space Museum -- a full-day immersive experience in Aviation at the Hazy Center in Chantilly provided by the Air and Space Museum's Education Department and volunteer docents that includes:

- · Orientation to Aviation, types of aircraft, types of propulsion, and aviation career fields
- Forces of Flight: basic aeronautics, reinforced with flight in computer flight simulators
- · Flight Planning with introduction to aeronautical charts and use of the E6B flight computer
- · Aircraft pre-flight and flight control movements on an actual Cessna 206 aircraft
- · Introduction to FAA approach and departure procedures from the Observation Tower

Classes consist of 12-16 Scouts, preferably age 12 or older. The maximum number of participants is limited by the availability of flight simulator computer desktop configurations in the Hazy Center's Science Technology, Engineering, Art and Math (STEAM) classroom.

Scouts are interested in Aviation Merit Badge can expect a full-day experience leading to the merit badge. Participation may be coordinated for individual scouts or for troop participation. Scouts may expect a \$12 fee for one portion of the flight simulator experience.

Preparatory work consists of reading the BSA-published Merit Badge Pamphlet and familiarity with the Aviation merit badge requirements.

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Fly Fishing Merit Badge Program



The Northern Virginia Chapter of Trout Unlimited (NVATU), in coordination with BSA National Capital Area Council (NCAC), conducts two annual Fly-Fishing Merit Badge events – fall and spring.

A one-day merit badge event hosted by NVATU will take Scouts through all of the merit badge requirements for Fly Fishing by means of an immersive agenda that focuses on:

- · Essential stream and environment conservation mindfulness
- · Virginia fish species and anatomy
- Entomology of trout food the macro-invertebrates that fish eat (bugs)
- · Orientation to fly rod & reel and wading gear
- Fly-Tying & Knot-Tying and Casting Techniques
- · Fishing a local area pond using the flies and knots learned in earlier sessions

Classes consist of no more than 16 Scouts, preferably age 12 or older. Scouts may expect a nominal fee of \$20 to cover all fly tying tools, handouts, and administrative costs including the rental of Locust Shade Park near Quantico in Prince William County.

Eight (8) slots open for the 10/19/24 class!

No equipment is required other than appropriate Scout dress for outdoor activity, including dry socks or boots for any stream work. All rods, reels, leader and fly tying material is furnished for the day's event. Scouts and adults should come with a bag lunch.

For Scouts interested in Fly-Fishing Merit Badge, but also in developing a life-long appreciation of and skill in fly-fishing, we can schedule individual and troop participation.

Wood Badge is the Boy Scouts of America's ultimate leadership training designed to meet the advanced leadership needs of Scouters in all aspects of the BSA, whether unit, district, or council level – from assistant den leaders to Scoutmasters, from Cubmasters to Venturing Advisors, from committee members to commissioners. It is a fun, energetic and inspiring course guaranteed to infuse your unit with fun and meaning – all designed to fulfill the mission of the BSA, and ensure our youth is getting everything they are promised from the program.

Reflecting the best of nearly a century of Scouting experience, Wood Badge draws upon the most current leadership models used by corporate America, academic circles and successful organizations throughout the country. Participants can expect to develop skills in many areas, including leadership theory, team building, problem-solving, communication, project planning and more. These skills can be taken back to packs, troops, crews and ships to help leaders guide youth in dynamic Scouting programs. Scouters will find these skills invaluable in their business and personal lives as well.

Wood Badge consists of two parts:

The first five full days is the initial group training, usually held over two weekends – the first weekend Friday through Sunday, and the second Saturday and Sunday (**Both weekends must be attended**).

The second part requires participants to apply the skills they learned by completing a 5-part plan (called a "ticket") over the following 18 months, leading towards the individual participant's vision of a better Scouting future.

Requirements for attending Wood Badge:

- 1. Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America and age 18 or older.
- 2. Have completed the basic position-specific training courses for their Scouting role.
- 3. Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record. Parts A, B, and C are required which includes a physical. Part C is required for everyone, including people who are not present for more than 72 hours.

A minimum (non-refundable) deposit is due with registration, and then full payment is due 45 days before the start of the course. Each Wood Badge course is limited to 48 participants. Per national guidelines, any course not having 30 fully paid participants 30 days prior to the start of the course is subject to cancellation.

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Additional Self-Pay Membership Renewal Notes

How unit coordinators can prepare

- 1. **Valid Emails** Key 3 (or delegate) should check the unit roster (https://my.scouting.org, login, Menu, select unit, Roster, export roster) to ensure all registered adults and leaders have valid email addresses.
- 2. **Whitelisting** Recommend parents/registered adults whitelisting "@scouting.org" or check their Junk/SPAM folders periodically for renewal messages
- 3. **My.Scouting.Org Accounts** Ensuring all parents have a my.scouting.org account. If not, they can create one at https://my.scouting.org, Create Account. It should ask for the BSA ID of their youth. If not, let Rus/Liz know and we can establish the parent/guardian relationship.

4. Review Reports

- a. **Monthly reports** Reports will be emailed to Unit Key 3 (CM/SM, CC, COR) for those whose registration is expiring within the next sixty (60) days.
- b. **Generate Reports (as needed) -** The Unit Key 3 can generate report from Organizational Manager (https://my.scouting.org, login, Menu, Organizational Manager, Reports you can adjust the date ranges as needed.)
 - i. Member Opt-Out Report those that have selected not to receive renewal emails
 - ii. Members Due to Renew those members due to renew within two months or who are lapsed
 - iii. Members who have renewed all youth and adult who have renewed this year.
- 5. **Youth Applications** Decide if the unit wants to automatically renew Youth Applications. This will reduce your approval workload.



Parents that do not have a My. Scouting account will need to create one.






